

MORGAN CHALLENGE CONSTITUTION



Morgan Challenge Championship

Morgan Challenge exists under the auspices of Classic Sports Car Club to provide an opportunity for competitors to participate in a one make Morgan championship.

The Challenge is overseen by three assemblies:-

- Race Committee
- Technical Committee
- An Annual Drivers' meeting

Race Committee

The duty of the Race Committee is to safeguard the Morgan Challenge, its relationship with event organisers and compliance with Motorsport UK procedures.

Race Committee members are:-

- 1) Chair (position open to registered competitors only)
- 2) Championship Co-ordinator
- 3) Technical Secretary
- 4) Publicity Co-ordinator
- 5) Treasurer
- 6) Tony Morgan-Tipp Co-ordinator

The committee may co-opt members as it sees appropriate. Any such member will be subject to ratification at the next Annual Drivers' meeting.

Technical Committee

The Technical Committee is responsible for reviewing proposed changes to the technical regulations for each season and then recommending to the Annual Drivers' meeting of the proposed changes.

During the season members of the Technical Committee may be asked to meet to discuss technical issues as requested by the Championship Co-ordinator.

The Technical Secretary is elected by the Class Representatives and the individual may stand down as a Class Representative if they so wish.

The Technical Secretary and Championship Co-ordinator will work closely with Motorsport UK each year to obtain a Championship permit and approval of the Sporting and Technical Regulations.

Technical Committee voting rights are held by Class Representatives only, the Chair may hold a casting vote if required.



Technical Committee members are:-

- 1) Chair: Chair of the Race committee
- 2) Championship Co-ordinator (holds no vote)
- 3) Technical Secretary
- 4) Class 1 representative
- 5) Class 2 representative
- 6) Class 3 representative
- 7) Class 4 representative
- 8) Class 5 representative
- 9) Class 6 representative
- 10) Class H representative
- 11) Class 0 no representative, refer to Championship Co-ordinator
- 12) Up to six representatives of the Morgan motor trade supporting the Morgan Challenge (to advise the Technical Committee by invitation and hold no vote)
- 13) Championship Stewards
- 14) Motorsport UK Eligibility Scrutineer

Class Representatives

Class Representatives are elected by registered competitors of the relevant class and should not be trade members. A Class Representative should attend at least 4 events per season, whilst not mandated to participate in the event the individual should be reasonably available to competitors for support (e.g. via phone, email or online meetings).

If a competitor in a Class gives notice in writing to the Championship Co-ordinator that he/she wishes to stand against the existing Class Representative an election will be held at the next Annual Drivers' meeting.

Championship Stewards

Championship Stewards will be elected at the Annual Drivers' meeting as required. Morgan Challenge requires three individuals to hold these roles concurrently and be reasonably available to consult on matters of the Championship.

The role of the Championship Stewards is detailed in Motorsport UK NCR Ch 5 App 4.

Chief Steward

This incumbent of the role is drawn from the three Championship Stewards. The incumbent is selected by the Championship Coordinator and the Chair of the Race Committee and ratified at the Annual Drivers' meeting.

Publicity

The Race Committee will promote Morgan Challenge with particular regard to recruiting new racers. Opportunities arise through promotions at race meetings; exhibitions and the websites associated with Morgan Challenge. Suggestions by any interested person are encouraged.



Annual Drivers' meeting

There will be a meeting of the registered competitors and trade members of the Technical Committee after the end of each season. Notice being given by the Championship Co-ordinator of the date and venue.

The agenda will include:-

- 1) Report from the Race committee (to include update on Publicity)
- 2) Report from the Technical committee (to include proposed changes to the regulations)
- 3) Report from the Championship Co-ordinator (to include provisional race dates for the following season)
- 4) Finance Report
- 5) Agreement of the honorarium for the Championship Coordinator
- 6) Arrangements for elections where needed
- 7) A.O.B.

Reports containing recommendations will be put to a vote and only adopted following majority approval at the meeting. Only registered competitors and Technical Committee members present at the meeting will be eligible to vote.
